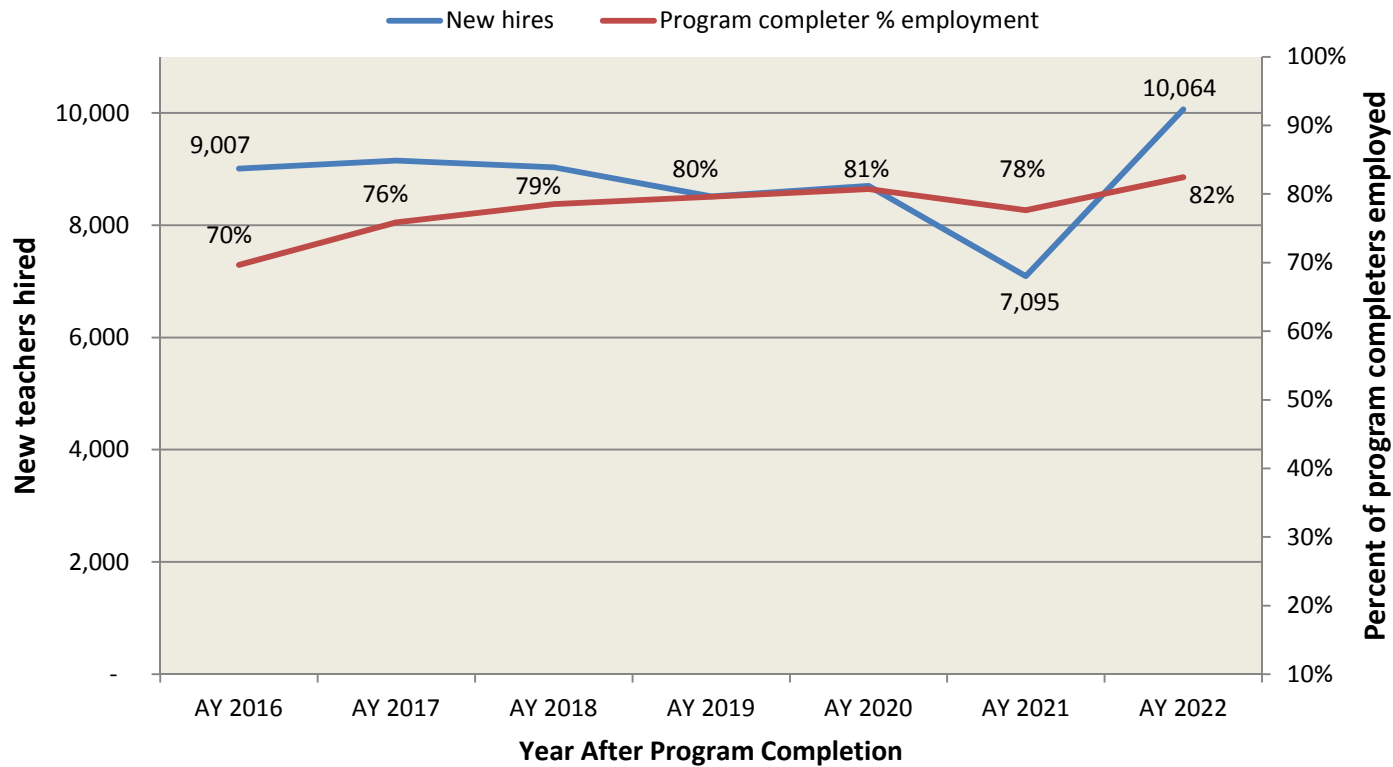


# Employment of Georgia Teacher Preparation Program Completers in Georgia Public Schools, AY2022

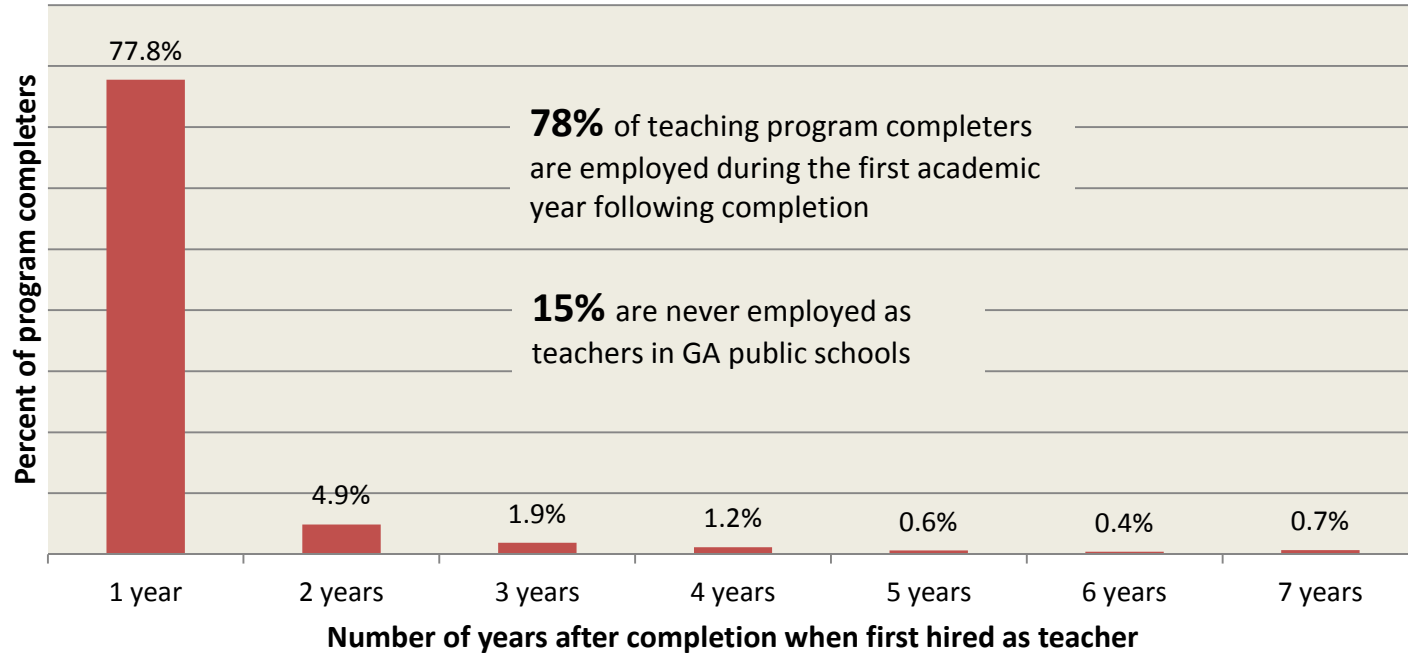
Total teachers employed:	122,729

*Years are Academic Years (AY), which run from Aug. 1 of the prior year through July 31 of the named year.*
































## How long does it take the average program completer to become employed?



*Individuals employed prior to completion are counted in year one.*

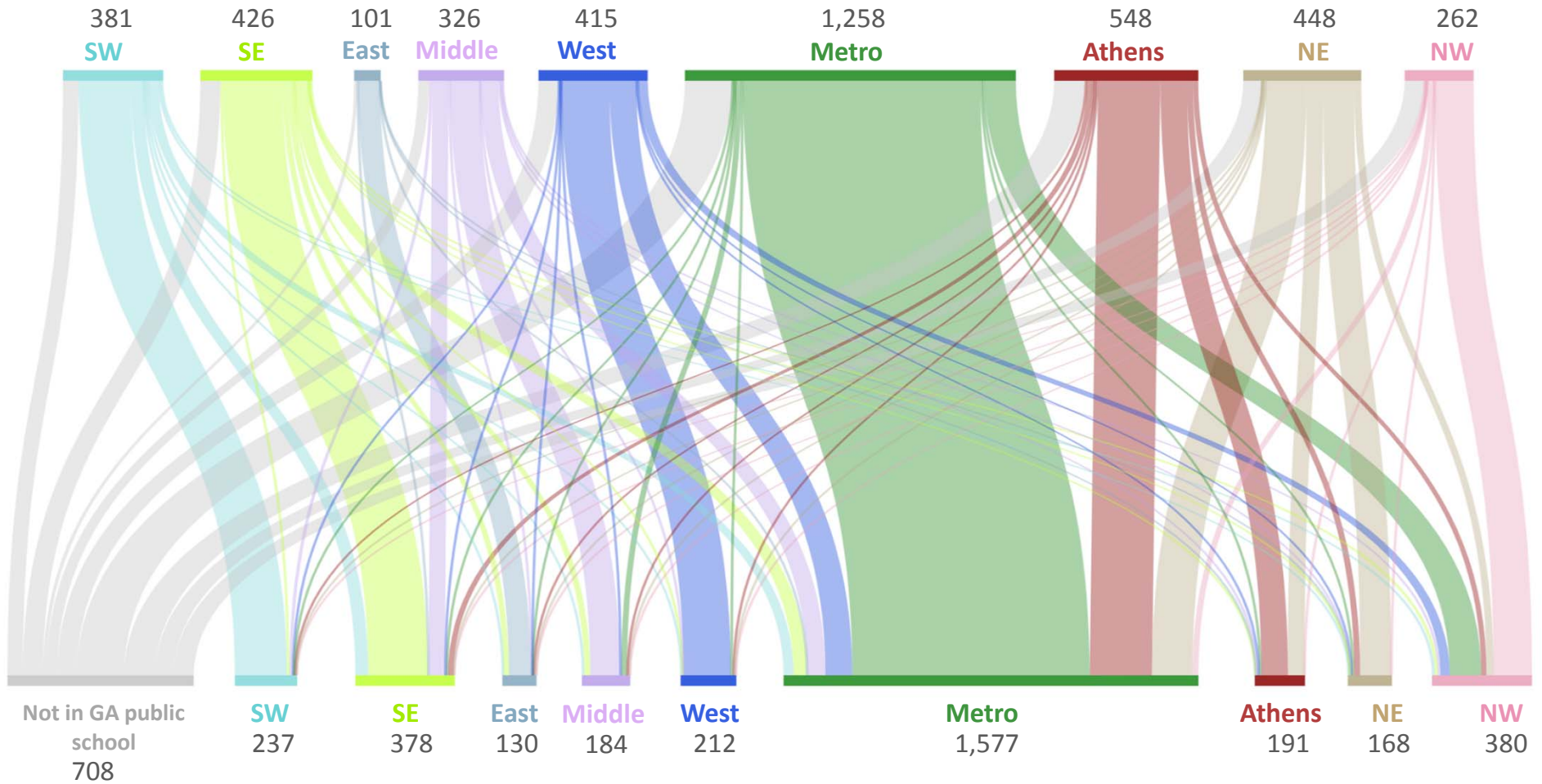

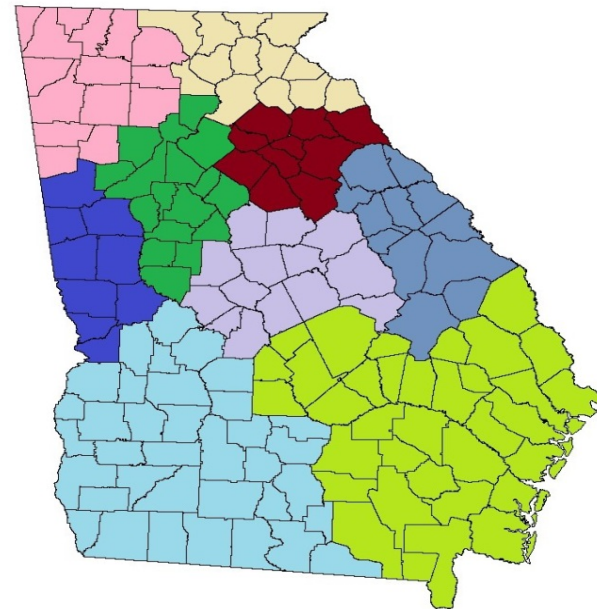
