13. <u>STUDENT LOAN SUSPENSION / REINSTATEMENTS</u>

The Commission reviewed the report, which indicated that there were 10 certificates *suspended* from March 8, 2007 through April 12, 2007. There were 13 certificates that had been *reinstated* because restitution is now being made on those student loans. There were 6 issues where notification had been received to suspend but releases were received prior to the actual suspension being implemented. Restitution is now being made on those student loans.

14. FINAL DECISIONS BY OPERATION OF LAW

The Commission reviewed the report, which advised of 21 cases now closed without an appeal for a hearing before an Administrative Law Judge. The report also advised that there was 1 case closed without an appeal for a review hearing before the Commission.

VI. EXECUTIVE SECRETARY REPORT

- **A.** Dr. Toth gave an update House Bill 603, which would allow an alternative certification route without testing for those holding advanced degrees.
- **B.** Dr. Toth gave an update on the legislation presented to move the Professional Standards Commission under the Department of Education.
- **C.** The Appropriations committee will try to give us \$50,000 in contracts to handle our backlog of cases. We will be able to contract lawyers from South Georgia and this will allow the Attorney General's office to concentrate on cases in the metro area and North Georgia.
