I. WORK SESSION

- Executive Secretary's report a) The Commissioners were informed that an end of the legislative session
 review would be emailed within the next couple of days; b) John Grant, Assistant Division Director or
 Educator Ethics, would be retiring on April 30th and this was his last Commission meeting. He thanked him
 for his many years of dedicated service to the PSC.
- Penney McRoy presented the proposed Standards for Service and Leader Preparation Programs. Although EPPs have been using the standards that the Commission adopted for initial *teaching* fields (e.g., Early Childhood Education, Secondary Math, Music), those standards have been challenging to apply to the fields of educational leadership and service (e.g., School Counseling, Media Specialist, Teacher Leadership). A task force of stakeholders was brought together to examine standards that would be more appropriate for these particular programs. The task force has made a recommendation to you that these standards be adopted for examining service and leader preparation programs.
- Kelli Young and Windy Fortenberry gave a presentation titled Certification 101. This presentation provided a glimpse of all the services that certification provides and a behind the scene look at how they are able to provide these services.
- Anne Marie Fenton and members of the Educational Testing Services (ETS), gave a presentation on Teacher Leadership Update-Assessment. Ann Marie Fenton thanked ETS for their continued collaboration with us.
- Chair Report Kami a) thanked Kelly for sending out the agenda that lists the work session agenda items for the year as they help Commissioners to learn about the various PSC projects, etc. b) reminded Commissioners that you are always welcome and encouraged to ask questions. That is the role that Commissioners play and that they should feel free to not vote if that is their desire.
