10. REVIEW HEARING EXTENSIONS

The Commission reviewed the *Review Hearing Extensions Report* concerning 1 hearing case. An Administrative Law Judge rendered Initial Decisions on the case referenced in the report. The report indicates Orders were issued by the Commission to extend time by 30 additional days to preserve the Commission's time to conduct review hearings.

11. STUDENT LOAN SUSPENSION / REINSTATEMENTS

The Commission reviewed the report, which indicated that there were 11 certificates *suspended* from July 12, 2005 through August 11, 2005. There were 7 certificates that had been *reinstated* because restitution is now being made on those student loans. The Commission was also advised that there were 15 issues where notification had been received to suspend but releases were received prior to the actual suspension being implemented. Restitution is now being made on those student loans.

12. FINAL DECISIONS BY OPERATION OF LAW

The Commission reviewed the report, which advised of 10 cases now closed without an appeal for a hearing before an Administrative Law Judge. The report also advised that there was 1 case closed without an appeal for a review hearing before the Commission.

VI. EXECUTIVE SECRETARY REPORT

The following was presented:

A. Dr. Toth spoke about the National Association of State Directors of Teacher Education and Certification (NASDTEC) and their annual 9th Professional Practices Institute, which will take place in Scottsdale, Arizona on October 19-21, 2005. He stated that all commissioners were invited.

B. Dr. Fran Watkins presented a slide show on the Georgia TAPP Program and discussed its success and some of the statistics associated with the program. She will distribute the video to to Georgia TAPP providers to use as a recruitment tool. The commissioners suggested that the PSC explore other ways to use the video for recruitment and publicity.

C. Dr. Watkins handed out a booklet with materials for the commission to consider on proposed changes to rules in chapter 505-3, Georgia Systemic Teacher Education Program, Georgia TAPP Program and Fort Valley State University.

Georgia TAPP Program

MOTION: (Muns / Thompson) To require passing scores on the appropriate state teacher content assessments as an enrollment requirement in a Georgia TAPP preparation program for: a) early childhood teacher candidates; b) special education teacher candidates who are assigned to teach core academic content in self-contained classes as the teacher of record; c) middle grades and secondary teacher candidates who do not have a major or its equivalent in the content he/she is assigned to teach. **PSC ACTION:** Approved

Fort Valley State University

MOTION: (Denty / Miller) To approve a timeline for developmental approval activities beginning August 15, 2005 and ending August 15, 2006, allowing Fort Valley State university and the Commission to plan, prepare and review a newly configured professional education unit and preparation program(s). The timeline and related activities are for a developmental review of a newly formed professional education unit and program approval.

PSC ACTION: Approved

D. Dr. Gary Walker gave the commissioners the Educator Ethics Division Report FY2005.

E. The commissioners were given a memorandum that was mailed to the Georgia Superintendents, College Deans and other designated personnel on Special Education Rule changes and the Highly Objective Uniform State Standard of Evaluation (HOUSSE) Georgia Core Academic Content Area Rubric.

F. Dr. Toth announced that the first Master Teacher Committee meeting was being held on Tuesday, August 16th, 2005, and that Governor Sonny Perdue would be speaking to the committee.

G. Dr. Toth updated the commissioners on the National Evaluation Systems progress. They are in the process of soliciting applications for persons who would like to serve on the committees. The deadline for these applications is Friday, August 26th, 2005. The committees will meet during the last week of September and the first week of October.

VII. CHAIRPERSONS REPORT

Chair Deloach announced that the next meeting will be held on Thursday, September 8, 2005 at Two Peachtree Street on the 29th floor in Atlanta. The October meeting will be held at Berry College.
