- C. Dr. Toth reviewed the Certification Phone Call Log and Tracking Base Backlog Levels sheet that was given to all the commissioners.
- **D.** Dr. Toth discussed confidentiality and how it should be exercised by all Commissioners and PSC staff. All Commission meetings and Commission Committee meetings are open to the public. All cases presented to the Commissioners for a Probable Cause Determination do not reflect educator names nor do they reflect school systems. Should a Commissioner recognize a case, they should abstain and refrain from any discussion. Once a Final Decision in any case has been reached and action taken against an educator's certificate, the record becomes subject to any and all Open Records Request. However, if the Final Decision results in a No Probable Cause determination, that file is sealed and expunged.
- **E.** The Governor has appointed two new commissioners to the commission. Pamela Greenway is an attorney and Municipal Court Judge in Houston County who has been appointed to our commission. The Governor will announce that a high school math teacher who is also chair of her department will be appointed to our commission as well.
- **F**. The Professional Standards Commission reviews appeals from educators who are denied certificates. We have an educator who currently holds a level 6 certificate and feels that he should have a level 7 certificate based on the

fact that he holds a Juris Doctorate degree. The Juris Doctorate degree has been determined by the PSC to be a level 6 certificate.

MOTION: (Thompson / Muns) To deny a request from Charles Williams to appear before the Commission to hear his appeal of the Executive Secretary's decision to deny his application for a level seven certificate and direct the Executive Secretary to submit the appeal packet in the January Meeting Materials for the commission to review to determine if the policy on Juris Doctorate Degrees has been followed.

The PSC will meet with Title IIA consultants to determine if Georgia will accept them.
