10. REVIEW HEARING EXTENSIONS

The Commission reviewed the *Review Hearing Extensions Report* concerning 2 hearing cases. An Administrative Law Judge rendered Initial Decisions on each case referenced in the report. The report indicates Orders were issued by the Commission to extend time by 30 additional days to preserve the Commission's time to conduct review hearings.

11. STUDENT LOAN SUSPENSION / REINSTATEMENTS

The Commission reviewed the report, which indicated that there were three certificates suspended from November 8, 2007 through December 13, 2007. There were 4 certificates that had been *reinstated* because restitution is now being made on those student loans. The Committee was also advised that there were 5 issues where notification had been received to suspend but releases were received prior to the actual suspension being implemented. Restitution is now being made on those student loans.

12. FINAL DECISIONS BY OPERATION OF LAW

The Commission reviewed the report, which advised of 9 cases now closed without an appeal for a hearing before an Administrative Law Judge. The report also advised that there were no cases closed without an appeal for a review hearing before the Commission.

B. Educator Preparation Standing Committee

Committee Chair, Dr. Craig Smith, gave a brief overview of the Educator Preparation Standing Committee's meeting on Wednesday, December 12, 2007. The committee had no items to present to the commission for a vote. Penney McRoy and Tom Hall discussed streamlining the program approval process with the committee. The committee also expressed concern about the operation of on-line and out-of-state programs especially relative to certification. On behalf of the Educator Preparation Standing Committee, Dr. Craig Smith requested that PSC staff examine issues related to online and out-of-state educator preparation programs operating in Georgia.

Tom Hall, Program Director for Educator Preparation, will be retiring December 31, 2007. He joined the staff in 1991 with the startup of the Commission in its present form. His areas of work responsibility included Computer Technology, Coordination of Information Specialists, Workforce Research, Open Records Response, Special Projects and Educator Preparation Program Approval. His position will also be posted.
- **C.** Kelly Henson informed the commission that they will receive a proposed agenda and documents pertaining to the commission meeting ahead of time.
