10. APPLICATIONS FOR CERTIFICATION REPORT

The Educator Ethics Review Committee recommended to approve a no probable cause determination on 28 cases reflected on the *Applications for Certification Report*.

11. REVIEW HEARING EXTENSIONS

The Commission reviewed the *Review Hearing Extensions Report* concerning 3 hearing cases. An Administrative Law Judge rendered Initial Decisions on each case referenced in the report. The report indicates Orders were issued by the Commission to extend time by 30 additional days to preserve the Commission's time to conduct review hearings.

12. STUDENT LOAN SUSPENSION / REINSTATEMENTS

The Commission reviewed the report, which indicated that there were 9 certificates suspended from May 12, 2005 through June 9, 2005. There were 8 certificates that had been *reinstated* because restitution is now being made on those student loans. There were 5 issues where notification had been received to suspend, however, releases were received prior to the actual suspension being implemented. Restitution is now being made on those student loans.

13. FINAL DECISIONS BY OPERATION OF LAW

The Commission reviewed the report, which advised of 17 cases now closed without an appeal for a hearing before an Administrative Law Judge. The report also advised that there was 1 case closed without an appeal for a review hearing before the Commission.

B. Educator Preparation Standing Committee

Committee Chair, Dr. Craig Smith, presented the report of the Educator Preparation Standing Committee.

1. Recommendation to the Commission for Metropolitan RESA - The Standing Committee for Educator Preparation recommends that the Metropolitan RESA Early Childhood Mathematics Endorsement and Reading Endorsement programs be granted Developmental Approval. A progress report addressing all areas for improvement shall be submitted by September 15, 2005.

2. <u>Recommendation to the Commission for Clayton College & State University</u> - The Standing Committee for Educator Preparation recommends that the Clayton College & State University Music Education program be granted Developmental Approval. A progress report addressing all areas for improvement shall be submitted by September 15, 2005.

3. Recommendation to the Commission for Georgia College & State University -

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A. The Standing Committee for Educator Preparation recommends Continuing Approval for the Georgia College & State University educator preparation programs listed below. In addition, the Standing Committee recommends submission of a progress report addressing all areas for improvement for these programs by December 15, 2005.

B. The Standing Committee recommends Continuing Approval with Conditions for the initial and advanced Educational Leadership programs. The Committee further recommends submission of a progress report addressing the not met standards and areas for improvement by December 15, 2005.

The Committee recommends Continuing Approval with Conditions for the ESOL Endorsement and Reading Endorsement Programs. The Committee further recommends that a Focused Visit on the not met standards be conducted by May 2006.

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5. <u>Recommendation to the Commission for Augusta State University</u> - The Standing Committee for Educator Preparation recommends that the Augusta State University Progress Report submitted March 1, 2005 demonstrates unsatisfactory progress due to a lack of evidence cited. The Committee further recommends the submission of a report documenting candidates' impact on P-12 student learning during their field experiences and clinical practice by January 1, 2006.

7. <u>Recommendation to the Commission for Clark Atlanta University</u> - The Standing Committee for Educator Preparation recommends that the April 1, 2005 Clark Atlanta University Progress Report demonstrates progress is being made. The Committee recommends submission of a report providing evidence of the changes proposed in the April 1, 2005 report by September 15, 2005. The Committee also recommends that the Focused Visit scheduled for fall 2005 be delayed pending PSC review of the September 15, 2005 progress report.

8. **Recommendation to the Commission for Georgia Southern University** - The Standing Committee for Educator Preparation recommends that the Georgia Southern University Music Education Program Progress Report submitted April 15, 2005 demonstrates that progress is being made. In preparation for the spring 2006 on-site approval review, the Committee recommends that the professional education unit focus on providing evidence of how pedagogical skills are integrated in Music Education courses. The unit should also focus on providing evidence that Music Education Candidates have a positive impact on P-12 student learning.

9. <u>Recommendation to the Commission for Paine College</u> - The Standing Committee for Educator Preparation recommends that the Paine College Progress Report submitted May 1, 2005 demonstrates satisfactory progress has been made; areas for improvement may be removed.

VI. <u>EXECUTIVE SECRETARY REPORT</u>

The Executive Secretary presented the following:

A. The Georgia Association of Educators has requested that we hold a Public Hearing on the Special Education Rules. The hearing will be held on Monday, July 11th, 2005, at 9 a.m. at Two Peachtree, 1st Floor Fitness Center, Atlanta, Georgia.

B. The Board of Regents has approved Macon State College to offer a Four Year Early Childhood Education degree in collaboration with North Georgia College and State University.

C. Dr. Gary Walker, Director of Educator Ethics, gave all the commissioners the Educator Ethics Workload Report and spoke briefly about it. He also announced that he has been working with the Georgia Public Broadcasting to develop a DVD on Educator Ethics. This DVD should be ready for distribution to schools in September 2005.

D. Maria Miller represented the PSC at the State Boards Education Liaison Committee Meeting that was held on June 6, 2005. She gave a brief description of the topics discussed at the meeting including the Committee for a New Georgia web-site and the International Baccalaureate degree.

E. <u>MOTION:</u> (Thompson / Miller) To adopt the Rules for Certification and Educator Preparation excluding the Rules for the School Psychologist as presented. <u>PSC ACTION:</u> Approved

F. Dr. Toth announced that he has hired Jane Huntley to head the Master Teacher program and Phyllis Paine to assist her.

G. NASDTEC 77th Annual Conference: Making the Grade: Links to Success– Commissioners Stephen Dartt and Louisa Moffitt attended the conference along with PSC staff members Dr. F.D. Toth, Rick Eiserman, Cyndy Stephens, Dr. Fran Watkins and Tom Hall in San Antonio, Texas.

H. The PSC is waiting to hear from the Attorney General's office to give us approval to sign the contract with National Evaluation System.

VII. <u>CHAIR'S REPORT</u>

Dr. Holly Robinson shared with the commission the new brochure for the Georgia Public Policy Foundation and indicated that Dr. Wanda West was pictured in it.
