I. <u>CALL TO ORDER/ROLL CALL</u>

Chair Sirmans called the meeting to order at 4:00 p.m. and Commissioners answered roll call for attendance.

II. VISITORS

Chair Sirmans welcomed the visitors.

V. <u>EXECUTIVE SECRETARY'S REPORT</u>

- We have no June birthdays this month.
- We were well-represented in sessions at the recent GASPA conference. GASPA is the Georgia Association of School Personnel Administrators. When not assisting HR Director's during and in between other conference sessions, Dr. Kelli Young and Windy Fortenberry presented the latest news and updates on certification. Anne Marie Fenton and Laurin Vonada conducted a session, along with two HR directors, on mitigating educator missteps, using the Model Code of Ethics for Educators. Dr.

Penney McRoy presented with GOSA and GaDOE on new teacher and leader induction. Bradley Golub, GaPSC's Troops to Teachers recruiter, manned a conference table to further the exposure of available support for military veterans and their spouses. We appreciate Georgia's HR directors and the important collaboration we have with GASPA and them.

• NASDTEC will hold their annual conference starting June 12th in Boston. NASDTEC is the National Association of State Directors of Teacher Education and Certification. We will be well represented at this conference as well.

VI. <u>CHAIR REPORT</u>

Chair Sirmans thanked Dr. Steve Barker for his service to the Commission and spoke briefly about his contributions to the Commission. Dr. Barker will be missed.

VII. <u>REVISIONS TO APPROVAL STANDARDS</u>

Dr. Angie Gant, Program Approval Director, presented the proposed Program Approval Standards which were updated to reflect the admission requirement changes the Commission adopted in May. Because a 2.5 GPA and passing the Program Admission Assessment are no longer requirements for being admitted to a program, the Program Approval Standards needed to be revised to align with those changes. These revised standards will come before the Commission for adoption during the July Commission meeting.

VIII. <u>RULES PREVIEW</u>

- 505-2-.168 INTERVENTION SPECIALIST ENDORSEMENT to adjust the formatting, revise the certificate types issued, and clarify the in-field requirements for teaching students in early intervention programs. (Kelli Young delivered the preview.)
- 505-3-.111 ELEMENTARY Agriculture Education (P-5) Endorsement program The new rule will expand preparation program options for those seeking certification to teach Agriculture Education in P-5 schools. (Julie Beck delivered the preview.)
- 505-6-.01 THE CODE OF ETHICS FOR EDUCATORS To reorder the definitions. (Laurin Vonada delivered the preview)

IX. GACE LITERACY SPECIALIST STANDARD SETTING

Anne Marie Fenton asked Commissioners to set the passing standard for the GACE Literacy Specialist Assessment (Test 560) that becomes effective July 1, 2022, yet will not have its first administration until October of 2022.

This field is a service field aligned to program standards that prepare individuals to serve as literacy specialists in grades P-12 and who will coach reading teachers.

A diverse and representative standard setting committee convened on March 22, 2022, to formulate a recommendation of where the passing bar should be set. The committee consisted of those who prepare Literacy Specialists from our state-approved Literacy Specialist program providers as well as educators in the field.

The committee was provided an overview of the test's structure, content, development, and the standard setting process. Following a review of the test form used in standard setting, panelists discussed among themselves what they saw being measured including:

- what content they expect to be particularly challenging for candidates and
- what content is especially important for beginning practice.

All panelists agreed the test is appropriate for licensure as a literacy specialist. The panel agreed with the recommended passing score from the multi-state standard setting: 73 out of 107 total points on the form reviewed.

After reviewing the projected pass rates, we recommend the Professional passing score (250 GACE scale), be set at -1 Standard Error of Measurement (SEM) below the committee recommendation.

MOTION: (Beth Townsend / Derek Easterling) To formally establish the passing score for the Literacy Specialist assessment (test code 560), effective July 1, 2022, for the Professional passing score (250 GACE scale), which equals the Recommended Study Value (RSV) minus 1 SEM (69 raw score points). **PSC ACTION:** Approved
