The Commission reviewed the *Review Hearing Extensions Report* concerning 2 hearing cases. An Administrative Law Judge rendered Initial Decisions on each case referenced in the report. The report indicates Orders were issued.

12. <u>STUDENT LOAN SUSPENSION / REINSTATEMENTS</u>

The Commission reviewed the report, which indicated that there were 14 certificates *suspended* from February 8, 2007 through March 8, 2007. There were 15 certificates *reinstated* because restitution is now being made on those student loans. The Committee was also advised that there were 12 issues where notification had been received to suspend but releases were received prior to the actual suspension being implemented. Restitution is now being made on those student loans.

13. FINAL DECISIONS BY OPERATION OF LAW

The Commission reviewed the report, which advised of 13 cases now closed without an appeal for a hearing before an Administrative Law Judge. The report also advised that there were 2 cases closed without an appeal for a review hearing before the Commission.

VII. EXECUTIVE SECRETARY REPORT

A. Educator Preparation Rules for Adoption

- C. A presentation on the GACE Faculty Resources Web-site was held on February 21st, 2007 at Macon State College. All RESA's and colleges and universities were invited. Many of the faculty members were impressed with the web-site.
- **D.** NASDTEC will have their annual conference on June 4, 2007 in Salt Lake City, Utah. If any of the commissioners have not attended a NASDTEC conference they are welcome to come.
- **E.** Representative Bill Hembree and others have presented a bill that would allow an alternative certification route without testing. The Professional Standards Commission, the Department of Education and Georgia Association of Educators are against the bill.
- **G**. Rick Eiserman, Director of Certification Policy, attended the SCOLT/FLAG (Southern Conference on Language Teaching/Foreign Language Association of Georgia) on March 2nd, 2007. Dr. Toth thanked him for attending the meeting. He gave the commissioners an email sent to Mr. Eiserman from Elizabeth Webb, Georgia Department of Education. In the email, Mimi Met, Senior Research Assistance for the National Foreign Language Center, said that she was amazed with Georgia's new foreign language certification rules.

VIII. EXECUTIVE SECRETARY REPORT

- Dr, Debbie Wilkes announced that our April 12th commission meeting will be held at the Brasstown Valley Resort in Young Harris, Georgia.
- Dr. Louisa Moffitt thanked Stephen Dartt for being so helpful and informative in navigating our new computer system during this transition period.
- Dr. Holly Robinson mentioned that during the Teacher of the Year program many people mentioned to her that the Ethics DVD has been very informative and helpful.
- Dr. Craig Smith thanked Dr. Gary Walker for the presentation that he gave to the Council for Exceptional Children in Macon, Georgia.
