12. <u>STUDENT LOAN SUSPENSION / REINSTATEMENTS</u>

The Commission reviewed the report, which indicated that there were 11 certificates suspended from April 13, 2006 through May 11, 2006. There were 7 certificates that had been reinstated because restitution is now being made on those student loans. There were 4 issues where notification had been received to suspend but releases were received prior to the actual suspension being implemented. Restitution is now being made on those student loans.

D. Valdosta State University Career Day was held on Tuesday, April 25th. The PSC was represented by Robert Maxson and Dr. Toth. Chair Terri Deloach attended in her capacity as a Principal of Pierce County Middle School. There appeared to be a decrease from previous years in the number of students with secondary education majors. Concerns were brought up regarding the Board of Regents requirement that secondary education majors complete a major in a content area and then complete the teacher education program requirements during a 5th year.

MOTION: (Muns / Gomez) For Dr. Toth to draft a letter to the Board of Regents expressing the commission's concern regarding the lack of secondary educators and lack of minority educators entering the teaching field. The commission would also like for a representative from the Board of Regents to address the commission at our June 8, 2006, commission meeting.
