MOTION: (Scott / Miller) To adopt the Findings of Fact found by the Administrative Law Judge as indicated in the Initial Decision and to adopt the Conclusions of Law reached by the Administrative Law Judge as indicated in the Initial Decision with the following changes.

II. Findings of Fact

The language in paragraph 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 7 of the Findings of Fact are adopted in their entirety.

The language in paragraph 6 of the Findings of Fact is deleted in its entirety and paragraph 7 of the Findings of Fact is renumbered paragraph 6.

The language in the second sentence of paragraph 8 of the Findings of Fact is deleted so that the paragraph states "The Georgia Professional Standards Commission alleged that Respondent failed to report an allegation of rape that was made to him on or around February 26, 2001 pursuant to O.C.G.A. §19-7-5 and the school protocol." Also, the paragraph is renumbered paragraph 7.

II. Conclusions of Law

The language in paragraphs 1 and 2 of the Conclusions of Law are adopted in their entirety.

The language in paragraph 3 of the Conclusions of Law is deleted in its entirety.

The Commission adds a new paragraph 3 which reads as follows:

3.

The Commission concludes that there is sufficient evidence in the record to show that Petitioner sustained its burden to prove a violation of Standard 9 of the Code of Ethics (Failure to Make a Required Report). The Respondent's failure to report the incident as reported to him and questioning the child regarding the alleged suspected abuse as shown in the record is a violation of the Meriwether County School System Child Abuse/Neglect Reporting Protocol.

Order

1.

The Commission rejects the recommendation of the Administrative Law Judge as stated in the Initial Decision. The Commission concludes that based on a review of the record, the recommendation for a finding of no probable cause by the Administrative Law Judge does not adequately reflect that there was a violation of Standard 9 of the Code of Ethics (Failure to Make a Required Report). The Commission therefore **ORDERS** that the Educator's Georgia Educator Certificate be issued a reprimand and the reprimand be effective immediately.

2.

If the Respondent decides to appeal this decision, he must file a petition within 30 days after service of this Final Decision pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 50-13-19.

VII. COMMITTEE REPORTS

A. Educator Preparation Standing Committee
