### 11. <u>STUDENT LOAN SUSPENSION / REINSTATEMENTS</u>

After hearing from both parties and careful consideration of all the evidence of record in this case, the PSC rejected the ALJ's decision and made the following findings of fact and conclusions of law.

### FINDINGS OF FACT

1.

Educator holds a certificate to teach in the State of Georgia. During the 2007-2008 school year, he taught high school in the Cobb County School System. On or about December 10, 2007 the Educator engaged in an inappropriate conversation regarding a pornographic website with some of his students. Alyssa, a student in Educator's class testified that she came into class and Educator was discussing the website, "Two girls and a cup." Tr. p. 6. Alyssa recalled that according to the Educator there was supposed to be a "girl with one breast" on the site. One student tried to pull it up on his cell phone but couldn't' get it to come up. Tr. pp. 7,8.

2.

Another student named Erika testified that she recalls Educator talking about a video on "Two girls and a cup" when she came to class but then she tuned him out so she could do her work. The Educator kept talking about a video, and had a number of male students crowding around his desk looking down at something. Tr. p. 10

3.

Peggie Constantino, the principal at the time, testified that when she talked to the Educator about the incidents, he admitted that it had occurred and that "he had tried to discuss with the student the site…" He admitted that he talked to the students two different times about the website as a topic and that he did discuss sex acts with the students. Tr. pp 19, 20. Ms. Constantino testified that exposing students to such a discussion and website fell outside of generally recognized professional standards as it exposed them to something, in this case a pornographic website, that they may have never heard of before. Tr. 24.

The Educator testified that he engaged in an inappropriate discussion with some of his students when one student asked him if it is possible to "eat pooh." They began talking about seeing two women eat another woman's feces on the website "Two girls and a cup." The Educator stated that he had seen that website and believed that it was not possible. He went on to state that he told the students that the website was disgusting and that they shouldn't look at it. Educator admitted that he didn't use good judgment in continuing to talk to the students about this topic.

The Code of Ethics for Educators defines the professional behavior of educators in Georgia. Standard 10 of the Code of Ethics Provides:

An educator should demonstrate conduct that follows generally recognized professional standards. Unethical conduct is any conduct that impairs the certificate holder's ability to function professionally in his or her employment position or a pattern of behavior or conduct that is detrimental to the health, welfare, discipline, or morals of students.

2

There is no question that discussing a pornographic website and/or video with students is outside of professional standards and impairs the Educator's ability to function professionally in his employment position. Educator admitted that he used poor judgment and was in agreement with his principal that what he did was outside of professional standards.

#### **DECISION**

1.

Having reviewed the entire record, after hearing argument from both sides, and giving due regard to the recommendation of the Administrative Law Judge, the Commission rejected the Initial Decision entered in this matter. In so doing, the Commission notes that the ALJ failed to consider all of the relevant evidence in the record.

2.

The Commission concluded that a sanction was appropriate in this particular case because a No Probable Cause finding as recommended by the Administrative Law Judge does not reflect the seriousness with which the Commission views the Educator's violation of the rules applicable to educators.

The Commission hereby ordered hat the Georgia educator certificate held by *DEAN WILFRED POTTS* shall be suspended for a period of 90 Contract Days to begin November 30, 2009 and shall conclude April 28, 2010.
