10. <u>APPLICATIONS FOR CERTIFICATION REPORT</u>

The Educator Ethics Review Committee recommended to approve a no probable cause determination on 43 cases reflected on the *Applications for Certification Report*.

11. REVIEW HEARING EXTENSIONS

The Commission reviewed the *Review Hearing Extensions Report* concerning 4 hearing cases. An Administrative Law Judge rendered Initial Decisions on each case referenced in the report. The report indicates Orders were issued.

12. STUDENT LOAN SUSPENSION / REINSTATEMENTS

The Commission reviewed the report, which indicated that there were 5 certificates *suspended* from August 14, 2008 through September 11, 2008. There were 3 certificates that had been *reinstated* because restitution is now being made on those student loans. The Committee was also advised that there were 5 issues where notification had been received to suspend but releases were received prior to the actual suspension being implemented. Restitution is now being made on those student loans.

13. FINAL DECISIONS BY OPERATION OF LAW

The Commission reviewed the report, which advised of 10 cases now closed without an appeal for a hearing before an Administrative Law Judge. The report also advised that there were 6 cases closed without an appeal for a review hearing before the Commission.

<u>MOTION</u>: (Bullock / Vasconcelos) To adopt the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law reached by the Administrative Law Judge. Based on a review of the whole Record and having given due regard to the findings of fact and conclusions of law entered by the ALJ in this matter, the Commission hereby reversed the decision of the Administrative Law Judge for the following reasons:

The Record showed that the Respondent failed to adhere to the grading practice communicated to her by her principal. In Ms. Reese's testimony she could not justify a number of the final grades she had given. The Record

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also showed that the Respondent did not exhibit the proper regard for the importance of calculating grades properly as shown by the numerous calculation errors made by the Respondent. The Record showed that Respondent admitted her errors to Superintendent Carey during the school system's investigation of the matter.

Based on a review of the whole record the Commission concluded that Respondent's failure to follow school practices with regard to grading exhibited a failure on her part to function professionally. Respondent's actions also constituted a pattern that the record showed was detrimental to the well being of her students.

The Commission rejected the Administrative Law Judge's recommendation that no sanction be imposed in this case. Based on the whole record developed in this case, it was hereby ordered that the Georgia teaching certificate held by Mary McGahee Reese be Suspended for a period of 10 Contract Days. The Suspension shall begin on September 29, 2008 and shall conclude October 10, 2008.
