### V. <u>EMPLOYEE SERVICE AWARDS</u>

Chair Wilkes introduced and congratulated the employees listed below and gave them their Service awards. Kelly Henson read the following:

### **Trey Brown – 5 Years**

Trey works in our Information Technology division. In June 2004, Trey was hired as a temp to modify our website so that educators could make online credit card payments for certification fees. This went very well, and Trey was brought on board full time as the Commission's webmaster – the position he holds today. Since then, he has been the lead developer on most of the Commission's websites. Trey is very creative and is always looking for new innovative ways to improve and enhance the Commission's websites and online features. He developed and application to encrypt passwords, which was critical to the agency's security strategy. He has also developed web services which allow our business partners to seamlessly interface with our websites. He also created the PSC Document Library download. His current projects include the TeachGeorgia website and the developing the new GaPSC website.

#### Kevin Bradley – 5 Years

Kevin was hired at the PSC on July 1, 2004, as an imaging forms processor (scanner). Kevin was consistently one of the top scanners and with a high degree of accuracy. Kevin's willingness to assist with other duties and his desire to become more familiar with other areas of certification led to his sitting with information specialists...first listening to them answer callers' questions and then answering some of the calls himself. He continued with his scanning responsibilities while doing this. Kevin's increasing skills on the phone and knowledge of certification rules resulted in his being promoted to a full-time Information Specialist on April 1, 2009. Kevin's customer service skills are excellent and he does whatever is takes to ensure that each caller's needs are met.

#### Valerie Jenkins – 15 Years

Valerie began her career at the PSC in June of 1994 as a secretary for Dr. Peggy Torrey who was Director of Assessment and Testing. In 1998, she transferred to the Technology Department, working with Dr. Tom Hall, for approximately two years. She applied for and was hired as a scanner in Certification in 2000, a position she held for two years. Valerie became an Information Specialist in 2002 and was promoted to an Evaluator in 2004. Valerie's experience starting as a scanner and progressing to become an evaluator have given her a unique ability to understand the entire certification process. She is a team member who can be counted on to provide whatever assistance is needed. She is diligent in processing cases and serving as Tier 3 to provide additional support to the information specialists.

### VI. <u>RECOGNITION OF ATALANT TESTING DIRECTORS</u>

Chair Wilkes thanked the Atlanta Area Testing Directors for their work in revising the Code of Ethics. Tracy Robertson, Heather Bolinger and Linda Calhoun spoke to the commissioners briefly about their work and they thanked the commission for the opportunity to work on the Code of Ethics.

Kelly Henson also thanked them for their work and said the following:

The revised Educator Code of Ethics for Georgia passed by the Professional Standards Commission at its May 2009 meeting added "Testing" as a new standard. The Standard reads as follows:

Standard 11: Testing - An educator shall administer state-mandated assessments fairly and ethically. Unethical conduct includes but is not limited to:

- 1. committing any act that breaches Test Security; and
- 2. compromising the integrity of the assessment.

While the Standard is brief, the guidelines and reporting procedures for the standard are very specific, thanks to AATD! The Atlanta Area Testing Directors group developed a proposal concerning the Ethics Standard that provides specific directions for teachers and administrators on testing procedures and violations. The Professional Standards Commission reviewed the AATD proposal and enthusiastically supported adoption of the document, including the recommendation for PSC sanctions of testing violations. The PSC has added a stipulation that superintendents and principals, if deemed appropriate by the Commission, will be subject to sanctions if violations occur under their watch.

The reporting procedures were reviewed throughout the state in RESA District meetings. The chart has been well-received by the audiences. Audience members were asked to make any recommendations of changes, deletions, or additions to the documents. The most often heard response is to make the procedures applicable to all tests.

Some interesting discussions arose at the meetings. At the Master Teacher Conference, one or two teachers expressed surprise that teachers could not confer with students about specific test questions in order to improve their instruction. We also heard this comment from some system administrators. They were reminded that curriculum and concepts can be discussed, but not specific test questions. Some administrators also realized that they did not know the testing rules and procedures well enough and will have a renewed interest in test training and procedures. It was emphasized at each meeting that the PSC does not want to play "Gotcha," but is concerned all personnel should be made aware of correct procedures and rules to avoid violations. If educators follow the rules, then everyone including students should have a satisfactory testing experience. If a student is harmed, it becomes an ethic's issue.

The PSC Commission adopted the Testing Procedures at the July, 2009 meeting and the AATD recommended procedures became the guideline for school personnel to follow in implementing the testing process. We want to publicly thank the members of AATD for their work in improving the Professional Standards Commission's work in the area of preventing and processing complaints related to testing issues.
