V. EXECUTIVE SECRETARY'S REPORT

- Derek Easterling and Brian Sirmans were reappointed to the Commission.
- We have two new Commissioners. Dr. Judi Wilson is Dean of College of Education for August University and she will fill the Higher Education position. She has been a faculty member at the university since 2003 and an educator for almost 30 years. Judi is certified to teach grades P-8 and taught elementary school in Athens, Perry, and Cochran, Georgia. She also served as a primary, middle school, and district-level administrator. She is passionate about partnerships and collaboration as well as providing support for new teacher induction. We look forward to working with her. Vonda Woodall is a social studies teacher at North

Oconee High School and a member of the Georgia Children's Cabinet. She will fill the High School Teacher slot. Woodall began her teaching career at Winder-Barrow High School in 2003 where she served as both a social studies department chair and graduation coordinator and was also named Teacher of the Year. Vonda has been a professional learning community leader, new teacher mentor, student teacher/practicum supervisor, and grant coordinator. During her career, Vonda has taught AP & General Psychology, AP & Honors World History, Economics, Government, U.S. History, and Sociology. Our work to support and facilitate the HBCU Collaborative is continuing. Now in its 5th year, the
Collaborative continues to meet twice each academic year to promote student enrollment and completion of
education programs at Georgia HBCUs. At the next meeting, on September 23rd, State Senator, Sonya
Halpern will provide an update on the Senate Study Committee on Excellence, Innovation, and Technology
at Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs), as well as other legislative initiatives impacting
HBCUs.

VII. RULES PREVIEW AND ADOPTION

Rules Preview

To begin this new rules cycle, the Commission previewed Certification rules, Educator Preparation rules, and a Professional Practices or Ethics, which will come before the Commission for their initiation consideration at the October 13, 2022, Commission meeting.

Windy Fortenberry previewed the proposed Certification rules amendments.

505-2-.193 COMPUTER SCIENCE MICRO-ENDORSEMENT-It is proposed that GaPSC Rule 505-2-.193 COMPUTER SCIENCE MICRO-ENDORSEMENT, dated July 1, 2022, be REPEALED and a new rule with the same title and number be INITIATED to update requirements for the endorsement in response to revised preparation program standards and rules. 505-2-.191 ELEMENTARY AGRICULTURE EDUCATION (P-5) ENDORSEMENT-It is proposed that GaPSC Rule 505-2-.191 AGRICULTURE EDUCATION ENDORSEMENT (P-5) dated July 1, 2019, be REPEALED and a new rule titled ELEMENTARY AGRICULTURE EDUCATION (P-5) ENDORSEMENT be INITIATED to change the title, revise formatting for consistency, and update the fields to which the endorsement may be added.

Laurin Vonada previewed of a proposed Ethics rule amendment.

505-6-.01 THE CODE OF ETHICS FOR EDUCATORS-It is proposed that GaPSC Rule 505-6-.01 THE CODE OF ETHICS FOR EDUCATORS, dated October 15, 2022, be AMENDED to add sections for sanctions and application procedures that include attachments to accompanying guidance.

Penney McRoy previewed the proposed Educator Preparation rules amendments.
