I. CALL TO ORDER/ROLL CALL

Chair Sirmans called the meeting to order at 4:00 p.m. and Commissioners answered roll call for attendance.

II. VISITORS

Chair Sirmans welcomed the visitors.

V. EXECUTIVE SECRETARY'S REPORT

Matt Arthur made the following announcements:

- Legislative update
- Happy birthday to Daniel Dooley who will celebrate his birthday on Friday, March 12th.
- We are still working on the logistics for our April Commission meeting. Unfortunately we just learned that DOE's boardroom will be under construction in April. They gave up a lot of their space and are in the process of renovating the space that they kept. We are trying to secure DOE's 10th floor meeting rooms but we need to make sure that they are able to accommodate a hybrid meeting. I want to make

sure that Commissioners can meet in-person and virtually in April as I certainly understand that we are not out of the woods yet. COVID is still a threat and everyone must continue to be careful.

- During the March 12, 2020, Commission meeting, Governor Kemp directed state agencies to implement teleworking policies. We ended our meeting rather quickly right after his speech. One year has passed and we have not missed a beat. It is important to me to express my admiration for the manner in which Georgia's school districts and schools, educator preparation providers (EPPs), educational organizations and especially our teachers have responded to the challenges presented by COVID-19. Our educator ethics division saw cases involving vaping from home and new on-line violations such as forgetting to turn their camera off when class had ended. As you know, they recently developed guidelines for school systems on how to handle vaping. Educator Preparation streamlined the approval process for endorsement programs, reducing the time involved in earning approval from nine months to three business days. To date, a total of 35 new endorsement programs have been added using the new process. The most frequently added programs are the Online Teaching Endorsement and the Dyslexia Endorsement. Covid did not stop the amount of cases, phone call or emails that Certification receives. Before Covid, when case numbers were high, certification held processing labs in our old boardroom. They learned that they were able to hold these labs virtually. On Tuesday, certification processed 657 cases, 587 PDS cases and responded to 360 emails and the work continues.

VI. CHAIR REPORT

Chair Sirmans called on Dr. Penney McRoy, Educator Preparation Division Director, to introduce her staff. Each staff member introduced themselves and spoke briefly about their job duties and interests outside of work.

VII. RULES ADOPTION

Anne Marie Fenton introduced the rules for adoption. On January 14, 2021, you initiated certification rules and ethics rules, which are being brought to you today for your consideration to adopt. You received the Adopt Packet last week. If adopted, these rules will become effective April 15, 2021. We received five public comments on Certification 505-2-.187 DRAMATIC WRITING MICRO-ENDORSEMENT which Windy Fortenberry will address and one public comment on the Ethics rule 505-6-.02 REINSTATEMENT OR RENEWAL OF A SUSPENDED OR REVOKED CERTIFICATE, which Tanis Miller will address.

Commissioners were asked if they had any questions or comments. Hearing none, Anne Marie moved ahead with the proposed rules adoption.

At the very end of Certification Rule 505-2-.27 CERTIFICATION APPLICATION, MyPSC AND TEST ELIGIBILITY PROCEDURES, (Section (10)(d) on page 8), the prior version reads:

Original:

“Yes” answers to PAQs (*Personal Affirmation Questions*) require submission of appropriate documentation to the Ethics Division.

The four word addition reads as follows:

“Yes” answers to PAQs require submission of **the online application and** appropriate documentation to the Ethics Division.

Anne Marie asked Commissioners if they had any questions or comments. Hearing none, a motion was introduced.
