I. CALL TO ORDER/ROLL CALL

Chair Sirmans called the meeting to order at 4:00 p.m. and Commissioners answered roll call for attendance.

V. EXECUTIVE SECRETARY'S REPORT

As I prepared the report for our meeting today, all of Georgia's public schools are back in session. We continue to send those district's the very best wishes for an excellent year of student learning and achievement. The GaPSC continues to support our students, teachers, staff, administrators, parents and communities, from all parts of our state, and pledges to maintain the high standard and quality of education our agency and our state seek to achieve.

Since our meeting in July, we continue to address and unpack the legislative work from the last session. One example is that we share responsibility in our work with the Teacher Retirement System, and the GDOE as we continue to collaborate on SB 150 or as it is commonly referred to as the Return-to-Work Bill. One question that was recently raised during discussions was "Can a retired teacher that meets all the requirements established by the law and TRS, and is fully certified by the GaPSC in meeting the current literacy certifications (since 2023), become a literacy coach?" That clarification was confirmed by all agencies. As of

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the first week of August, 310 candidates have been approved with 82% falling into three categories of Special Education, math and science.

Another example of our current legislative unpacking work deals with the creation of the Literacy Coach Endorsement. We mentioned this work in last month's report, and we are still on track to be ready to share this with the Commission in October. We continue to work with the task force as we refine the final draft. One next step taken in our last session was a presentation by ES Pearson, our testing vendor, about the development of an assessment process for the literacy coaching endorsement qualification. Also, the Educational Leadership taskforce working on the Tier I and Tier II leadership certification update is on track. Both projects will need your official review, public comment period, and ultimately the Commission's recommendation and or approval.

Dr. Thomas shared that our Certification division continues to address processing certificates for employed educators as they return to school. We receive around 300 new cases a day. As of this report, we have approximately 400 cases on hold for missing documentation, and around 1,500 employed educators moving through the final stages of processing. The division has dropped the turnaround time from three weeks to roughly 11 days. Special thanks to Krystal Doherty for her leadership and the entire team for their efforts in maintaining Georgia's leadership as one of the fastest rates for certification completion for agencies from around the country.

Another priority for certification is the work being led by Melina Ljuljanovic with our new Evoke system. A working group has been formed to focus on readiness, both internally and externally, for all end users, as the Peach Portal prepares to go live in November.

I did want to remind everyone that our full Commission meeting on Thursday, September 10, will be in person. Ms. Shaat will be pushing out the agenda for both meetings. On September 9, the committee meetings will be virtual. On September 10, we plan to have some professional learning updates that morning, as part of a work session, and the regularly scheduled business meeting will be at 1:00. (Please feel free to contact me or Ms. Shaat directly if there are any topics you would like for us to address as part of the PL.)

Unless there are questions from our Commissioners, that concludes my August report.

Chair Kedrione Harris of the Educator Ethics Review Committee (EERC), gave a preliminary review of the cases.

NOTE - Chair Harris informed Commissioners that the EERC committee revisited ***Preliminary Investigation Determination*** cases 26-7-60 and 26-7-62 that were voted on at the July 8, 2026, EERC meeting to Investigate. These two educators did not hold state certification at this time. The EERC voted to change their vote from Investigate to No Jurisdiction.

B. Educator Preparation Standing Committee

Committee Chair, Dr. Holley Roberts, presented the report of the Educator Preparation Standing Committee.

Northwest Georgia RESA - The Committee recommends Developmental Approval of the STEAM Endorsement and Micro-Endorsement.
