I. CALL TO ORDER/ROLL CALL

Chair Sirmans called the meeting to order at 4:00 p.m. and Commissioners answered roll call for attendance.

V. EXECUTIVE SECRETARY'S REPORT

I first want to acknowledge the good news about the State's increase in overall graduation rate (87.2%). It is great to see our young people doing well and reaching this important milestone, but we know that does not happen by accident. So, I want to celebrate Georgia teachers who meet the GaPSC standards that are a part of our work in our Educational Preparation Programs (Colleges and Universities) where our pre-service teachers are trained. 21 Public college/universities: 21, Private college/universities: 22, GaTAPP EPPs (RESAs, TCSG, LEAs): 6 Endorsement-only EPPs (1 RESA & 5 LEAs). That includes professional staff meeting the GACE expectations for content, literacy, and ethical expectations. This helps to ensure that our teachers are well prepared, and I believe, a direct reason why our graduation rate continues to improve.

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We continue sharing and reviewing the Ethical Considerations for Appropriate Use of AI by Educators with the guidance documents we created. We are discussing this new guidance work at a variety of upcoming conferences both statewide and nationally. We continue to receive feedback from the survey embedded in the document. This information, and more, will continue to be used as we develop supports to provide users with an ongoing opportunity to suggest any additions or enhancements, and to share helpful resources about avoiding missteps when using AI.

I am pleased to inform the Commission that we have all of our new investigators on board, in our Ethics division and they are all actively beginning to address their assigned caseloads. I would also like to welcome our new Asst. Attorney General associates, Mr. John Smith and Jehae Kim.

From our Educator Preparation division, beginning this semester, all approval review teams now include a Literacy Focused Reviewer who will focus on examining evidence related to the implementation of the Foundations of Reading, Literacy, and Language Standards in all teacher preparation programs. With a total of 71 approval reviews between 2025 and the spring of 2030, approval review findings will serve as an important indicator of the fidelity of implementation of the literacy standards among our program providers. Ed Prep staff began their Fall Webinar series on September 24, with a one-hour webinar on Writing Narratives for Approval Review Reports. 170 people attended the webinar and the follow-up survey indicated they found the webinar very helpful.

We continue to be pleased with the new GACE implementation. The website is posted at www.gace.es.pearson, which includes costs, information about the new testlet models, preparation materials, FAQs, and more. As I mentioned at last month's meeting, we moved forward to modify the drop date for the scores to better facilitate our work in Certification. There is a lot of work that goes on behind the scenes to get the scores posted so that Certification and local Human Resources departments can utilize the data. We appreciate everyone's patience as we work with the new process.

The work with SR 237 (the recruitment of and retention of educators) is ongoing. We have had multiple virtual meetings with all agency heads and association leads during the first couple of weeks in October. More foundational work of narrowing the focus on the group's strategic priorities has been done. The Southern Regional Education Board (SREB) continues to facilitate this work, and our four sub-groups continue to address the key categories of Leadership, Values, Pathways, and Marketing. We have added a new ad hoc committee that is made up of Agency Technology experts from each of our eight agency groups. All agencies have data collection responsibilities, and we are working to design better efficiencies among our agencies. Each of the working groups continue to refine and identify solutions that can positively impact our five committees. Our next in person meeting will take place on November 7. Our goal is to provide the General Assembly and the Governor's office with a strategic plan and a specific set of recommendations that can assist the recruitment and retention of educators.

VI. <u>RULES INITATION</u>
