

Georgia Professional Standards Commission Preparation Program Effectiveness Measures (PPEMs)

Purpose

Beginning in academic year 2015-16, the Georgia Professional Standards Commission (GaPSC) will use Preparation Program Effectiveness Measures (PPEM) to evaluate educator preparation programs. Specific measures included in Teacher Preparation Program Effectiveness Measures (TPPEM) and Leader Preparation Program Effectiveness Measures (LPPEM) are designed to provide data on program quality, as well as program impact on teaching and learning in P-12 schools. Use of PPEM data by GaPSC and other state agencies, as well as by education program providers (EPPs), will accomplish several purposes:

- Hold EPPs accountable to high program standards;
- Apply a consistent set of state-determined effectiveness measures across all teacher and leader preparation programs;
- Improve the effectiveness of teacher and leader preparation programs;
- Inform the citizens of Georgia about preparation program quality; and
- Improve teaching and learning in P-12 schools.

The new program evaluation system will be piloted for two years before it becomes consequential. Please see the timeline on page two for additional information.

This document is intended to provide an overview of the PPEM measures, as well as GaPSC plans for implementing the new program evaluation system. As it will be a dynamic document, readers are encouraged to frequently check the website for updates. Revision dates will be included in the footer.

2014-15	Pilot Phase II	All available data from all program providers will be used to for a comprehensive pilot of data collection, analysis, interpretation, and reporting procedures. In addition to the data piloted in Phase I, limited edTPA data and limited TEM/LEM data may be available and if so, will be incorporated. Procedures, as well as the measures themselves, will be evaluated and refined to inform full implementation.			
2015-16 Full and beyond Implementation		PPEMs will be fully implemented for all EPPs. All PPEM components will be collected, analyzed, and reported to EPPs, and shared with all stakeholder agencies. Limited data may be shared with the public in the form of a dashboard report, with carefully worded explanations regarding each measure and the fact that this is the first year of full implementation. PPEM data will be incorporated into the GaPSC approval process.			
		A regular/ongoing cycle of implementation evaluation will begin for the purpose of continued improvement of PPEM data collection, analysis, interpretation, and reporting procedures. Adjustments may be made in measures and/or procedures in 2016-17 and beyond.

¹ The GaPSC reporting year will change from the current fiscal year (July 1 – June 30), to September 1 – August 31. As the first two GACE assessment attempts are counted for PPEM, the revised reporting year enables EPPs to grant eligibility to test later in the program while giving candidates more opportunities to test for the second time if needed during the summer after program completion. (All candidates must attempt the GACE content assessment at least once prior to program completion.) In addition, the new reporting year gives EPP candidates additional GACE assessment opportunities to be counted toward the "best attempt" score required by Title II. The new reporting year will become effective 2014-2015.

²Data elements in the GaPSC Annual Program Performance Data measure will be weighted as described below:

- 20% Completion Rates
- 10% Retention Rates
- 10% Yield
- 30% Completer Survey
- 30% Employer Survey

³Two surveys of program graduates/completers will be administered:

- 1. First, a survey of recent graduates will be conducted to gather perceptions of preparation, as well as intent data. In addition to survey items related to preparation, intent items might include questions such as:
 - a. Do you intend to seek employment in a Georgia public school or public charter school?
 - b. Do you intend to seek employment in a private school, other education organization, or in another industry (not education)?
 - c. If you intend to seek employment in a GA school, to how many school systems have you applied?
 - d. Have you applied for teaching jobs in the field in which you were prepared?
 - e. Have you applied for teaching jobs in a field you added by passing the GACE content assessment?

Completion of this survey will be tied to the certification process so that it must be submitted before a certificate will be issued.

While data resulting from this survey will not be included in PPEMs, these data will be useful in explaining yield and will be included in PAAR, where the EPP will be able to use them to respond to positive or negative trends.

2. A second survey will be conducted after completers are hired in a Georgia public/or a Georgia public charter school. Formerly referred to as the *Completer Survey*, the *Inductee Survey* will be administered only to those completers employed in a GA public /charter school where the state-mandated evaluation system is used.

 - a. Are you currently employed as an assistant principal or principal in a Georgia public school or public charter school? If NO, are you employed as a teacher or other school professional in a Georgia public school or public charter school?
 - b. Do you intend to seek employment in a Georgia public school or public charter school?
 - c. Do you intend to seek employment in a private school, other education organization, or in another industry (not education)?
 - d. If you intend to seek employment in a GA school, to how many school systems have you applied?
 - e. Have you applied for assistant principal/principal jobs?

Completion of this survey will be tied to the certification process so that it must be submitted before a certificate will be issued.

While data resulting from this survey will not be included in PPEMs, these data will be useful in explaining yield and will be included in PAAR, where the EPP will be able to use them to respond to positive or negative trends.

2. A second survey will be conducted after completers are hired in a Georgia public/or a Georgia public charter school. Formerly referred to as the *Completer Survey*, the *Inductee Survey* will be administered only to those completers employed in a GA public /charter school where the state-mandated evaluation system is used.
