The mission of the Georgia Professional Standards Commission (GaPSC) is to build the best prepared, most qualified, and most ethical education workforce in the nation. This document highlights progress and actions of this state agency during second quarter 2023.

A Message from Matt Arthur

As a new academic year launches, I thank you not only for the work you do each and every day, but also for your collaborative partnership with us, which we greatly value. Each of you has such an important and impactful role in effective education in Georgia, and we remain committed to supporting you.

With our state's focus on reading and literacy, we invite you to read the newly adopted Educator Preparation Rule <u>505-3-</u>.03, Foundations of Reading, Literacy, and Language. This new policy, which was informed by a representative task force, establishes the standards educator preparation providers (EPPs) will use to incorporate preparation to teach reading across all teacher preparation programs. The following brief overview of the structure of this new policy may be helpful in understanding its far-reaching impact on initial teaching preparation and what teaching program completers will know and be able to do.

Within the rule, teaching fields are grouped according to certification grade levels or subject areas. Although there are similarities, standards differ for each grouping based on the level of knowledge and skills appropriate for the grade level or subject areas. One level consists of fields that require a deeper knowledge and demonstration of the skills associated with the teaching of reading (e.g., elementary), while the other level consists of fields requiring an awareness of reading fundamentals (e.g., secondary fields). Essentially, all teaching field programs will involve preparation in reading at varying levels.

Within each of the two levels (demonstration or awareness), are groups of teaching fields for which differentiated preparation standards have been established. The program groupings are as follows:

Preparation fields requiring demonstration of knowledge and skills:

- Birth Through Kindergarten and Special Education Preschool
- Elementary Education (P-5), Special Education General Curriculum/Elementary Education (P-5), and Middle Grades Reading
- Special Education (P-12) fields of General Curriculum, Adapted Curriculum, Deaf Education, Physical and Health Disabilities, and Vision Impairment

Preparation fields requiring awareness of knowledge and skills:

- Middle Grades (4-8) teachers of English language arts, mathematics, science, and social science
- Secondary (6-12) fields: Agriculture Education, Business Education, Career & Technical Specializations, Economics Education, English Education, Family and Consumer Sciences Education, Geography Education, Healthcare Science, History Education, Marketing Education, Mathematics Education, Political Science Education, Science Education, and Speech Education
- P-12 fields of Art, Computer Science, Dance, Drama, Engineering and Technology, English to Speakers of Other Languages, Health and Physical Education, Music, and World (formerly Foreign) Languages

GaPSC-approved EPPs are required to implement the new standards by the fall semester of 2024. As all teaching field content standards have changed, so will the GACE. By July 1, 2025, all GACE teaching field content assessments must be aligned with the science of reading and measure different levels of knowledge and application appropriate for the preparation field.

We look forward to your continued input and involvement in this collaborative work to ensure effective literacy education.

Educator Preparation

Enhancements

The following are examples of second quarter GaPSC actions aimed at enhancing the quality of our services:

- The <u>Preparing Ethical Paraprofessionals</u> video launched to assist RESA's in promoting and sharing the value of the Paraprofessional Ethics Modules with their partner districts and their paraprofessionals. The video focuses on the importance of paraprofessionals, the need for the modules, an overview of module content, and feedback from those who have completed the training. These instructional modules are available through each RESA.
- Enhancements made to GaPSC's call center routing resulted in a reduction of the average abandon rate by 57% and the average talk time by 26%. Examples of enhancements include, but are not limited to, routing calls to the appropriate call center staff on first selection rather than requiring a transfer or escalation.
- The Ethics Division continued its targeted focus on closing old cases and decreasing the number of extended cases, all of which allows increased time to focus on current cases. These efforts resulted in a 69% decrease of extended cases in FY23 over FY22.
- Work began on the 2023-24 Avoiding Ethical Missteps: Georgia's Code of Ethics for Educators PowerPoint made available annually to EPPs and school districts to use when conducting ethics training. This instructional resource is now available at GaPSC Resources.
- A *Guidelines for Breach of Contract* document was developed to provide further information regarding Standard 9: Professional Conduct of the Code of Ethics for Educators and is available at <u>GaPSC Resources</u>.
- The Certification Division launched the automated conversion of Induction certificates, eliminating the need for educators and their employing districts to apply for certificate conversion. Since implementation, over 3,300 Induction certificates have been automatically converted.
- The <u>Guidance for Interpreting and Implementing Rule 505-3-.01 Requirements and Standards for Approving</u> <u>Educator Preparation Providers and Educator Preparation Programs (Rule Effective Date June 15, 2023)</u>, was updated to reflect recent amendments and published.
- Work began on two guidance documents for EPPs, which are now posted.

- The <u>GaPSC's Video Series</u> launched. The list of currently available titles include:

- GaPSC's support of transitioning military veterans and their spouses continued with staff specifically devoted to recruiting these individuals. During the second quarter, Military Support staff attended one conference and four military sponsored events, as a vendor to promote the program, and held 16 briefings across five Georgia military bases.
- The Southeast, Southwest, Athens, and West P-20 Regional Collaboratives convened during second quarter. These regional meetings bring together colleges of education, P-12 educators and leaders, and RESAs to improve education in each region.  In addition to presenting at statewide conferences, GaPSC staff provided multiple professional learning and technical assistance events to assist school districts, schools, and EPPs as they work with their in-service educators, and EPP faculty as they work with their pre-service educator candidates. GaPSC presented to 1,099 individuals during second quarter.

Support by the Numbers

During first quarter of calendar year 2023, GaPSC:

- Answered 11,676 certification calls, totaling 23,911 year to date (YTD)
- Responded to 14,660 certification emails, totaling 28,984 YTD
- Opened 29,568 certification cases, totaling 65,614 YTD
- Completed 26,724 certification cases, totaling 62,467 YTD
- Completed 530 ethics cases, totaling 940 YTD

Between April 1 and June 30, 2023, GaPSC continued approval for 16 existing programs, and approved 6 new endorsement programs. During this quarter, work was conducted on new or continuing approval reviews for a total of 9 program providers.
