# Commission Responsibility

#### **Georgia Code 20-2-981.1**

It shall be the duty of the commission to adopt standards of performance and a code of ethics for educators... which are generally accepted by educators of this state.

The standards of performance and code of ethics adopted by the commission shall be limited to professional performance and professional ethics...which does not include one's personal life as long as it does not impact one's professional live.


# THE GEORGIA CODE OF ETHICS FOR EDUCATORS (COE)

- ☐ Defines the professional behavior of educators in Georgia and serves as a guide to ethical conduct.
- ☐ Contains 10 standards that represent the conduct generally accepted by the education profession.
- Defines unethical conduct justifying disciplinary sanction and provides guidance for protecting the health, safety, and general welfare of students and educators, and assures the citizens of Georgia a degree of accountability within the education profession.

# Application Cases

Investigations

Stem from new applicants or educators applying for renewal/upgrade checking "yes" on a Personal Affirmation Question (PAQ).

Consists of 9 PAQs that must be answered to ensure the candidates do not pose a danger to Georgia's students.

# Complaint Cases


Must report to the PSC the following within 90 days of the date of becoming aware of:

- ☐ Any actual or alleged breach of the Code of Ethics unless law or local procedure require reporting sooner.
- ☐ Any alleged or proven violation of state of federal law unless law or local procedure require reporting sooner.
- ☐ Convictions of Violation of the Georgia Controlled Substance Act (VGCSA) must be reported by the educator within 10 days of the conviction. Failure to do so can result in a revocation.

The remaining percent of cases represents violations not covered by the Code of Ethics (sanction of license by another state or licensing agency, other good and sufficient cause, etc.)

# Reviewing Complaints

Yes answers on PAQs automatically open a case.

Written complaints are reviewed by staff and a recommendation is made to the Commission:

- No Probable Cause (NPC)
  - Investigate
    - Remand
  - No Jurisdiction



# Investigative Process

**Interview Complainant -** Gather supporting facts to the original complaint



#### **Collect Evidence**

Evidence is anything that can provide relevant information or something that can be used to validate other information.

- Are recordings available?
- Are there any records related to the allegation?
- o Are there any witnesses?
- Are there any prior incidents? Check with previous schools.

**Interview Witnesses** – Verify written statements

Interview the Accused – Always given an opportunity to respond to the allegations





## What are potential GaPSC sanctions?

### **Potential Sanctions**

- Warning
- ☐ Reprimand
- ☐ Suspension-1 day to 3 years
- ☐ Revocation
- Denial
- ☐ Sanctions are permanent and remain on the certificate
- ☐ Suspensions and higher are reported to national database






# **Enforcing Sanctions**

The superintendent and the superintendent's designee for certification shall be responsible for assuring that an individual whose certificate has been revoked, denied, or suspended is **not employed or serving in any capacity** in their district.

Both the superintendent and the superintendent's designee must hold GAPSC certification.
