## High School Education Pathways

The group then had a healthy discussion about the profession of teaching, and how we can
promote teaching as a positive career choice. Claire Garrett proposed a public service initiative
of a project known as GREAT = Giving Respect to Educators As Treasures to encourage the
credibility of the profession of teaching and to show the public the value of teachers.

# Induction and New Teacher Progress

The group talked about induction and new teacher progress. Claire mentioned the idea that partners work together on the PLP. This led to the discussion of the need for effective mentors.
