What is the Vision?

- Ensure each of our schools embraces an ethical culture
- Place an intentional, preventive focus on instruction in the Georgia Code of Ethics for Educators and ethical principles that guide decision making
- Use the Model Code of Ethics for Educators (MCEE) to guide professional decision making
- Reinforce and foster that each educator is a professional in the profession of education
- Elevate the profession

Elements of Our Shared Plan

- Pre-Survey (knowledge and values)
- Post-Survey
 - includes open-ended statements
 - knowledge, values, AND application
- Use of ethical dilemmas as a teaching tool
- Use the Model Code of Ethics for Educators (MCEE)
- Involve the total staff (anyone who is in contact with students, parents, and community)
- Launch in 2018-2019 Academic Year

What is the Implementation Plan?

- You just learned about collaborative development of a shared master plan with common elements, such as pre/post survey, select strategies, summative assessments, etc.
- Each school is also working to customize its own implementation plan based on context and needs
- There is joint development of shared resources, as well as individual school resources that will be shared with all schools
- We want to measure effectiveness with the survey and virtual meetings with the core planning teams
